Bill Brandt '65

Bill Brandt '65 is the owner of Brandt Cattle Co., a family-owned and operated ranch based in Brawley, California. Brandt Cattle Company has established their company on sustainability - which is the driving force in the way they operate the ranch and promote a healthy environment. In 1972 Bill's dad wanted to retire, and over time he improved his father's feed yard to continue raising cattle. When his dad owned the yard, it included around 1,200 heads of cattle. Today, Bill is proud to have expanded the Brandt Cattle Co., to about 140,000 heads.

Bill graduated from Brawley Union High School in 1963 and decided to continue his academic career at the University of Arizona. Despite not knowing many people due to the fact that he was born out of state, he found a second home in Delta Chi.

Bill was initiated in 1965 and says he was immediately surrounded by such a diverse group of people who instantly clicked together. Bill's accomplishments and contributions have been recognized as he was the recipient of the 2009 University of Arizona College of Agriculture and Life Science Alumni Achievement Award and the Brawley Chamber of Commerce 2010 Branding Iron award.

Bill is married to his wife, Sue 51 years and has three sons and two daughters. His legacy at Brandt Cattle has continued through his sons and now contributes to the company. His son Eric owns One World Beef, a meat processing plant, while Mark manages the family farming operations.

Both personally and academically, Bill's brothers in Delta Chi gave him the support system he needed to pursue his degree. He feels extraordinarily blessed to have had the experience that he did with the Arizona chapter. He still remains in touch with his brothers today.
